

MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE TERRITORIAL  
AERONAUTICAL COMMISSION, held on Monday  
September 30, 1929, at Room 65, Young Bldg.  
Honolulu, T. H. at 3:30 p.m.

There being no changes in the minutes of the previous meeting, they were approved as circulated.

Report from Mr. Bigelow re salt water pump:--(John Rodgers)

Mr. Bigelow reported that he could get a small gasoline pump for a week or two to pump salt water on a small area of the field, as an experiment. If found worth while, then the Commission will have to buy a larger pump.

Moved by Mr. Peacock and seconded by Mr. Boyer that we borrow a small pump for experimental purposes before deciding to buy one. Carried.

Mr. Bigelow reported that the matter of water is being taken care of, and will be ready to ask for bids within the next two or three days. The Hawaiian Electric Company is getting out estimates of electric installation. The estimates will be of two types: underground conduits and overhead poles, action to be expected within the next two or three days.

Chairman's report on trip to John Rodgers with Mayor Wilson and Mr. Whitehouse:

The Chairman reported that Mayor Wilson, Mr. Whitehouse, and he had made a trip to John Rodgers Airport and went over the roadway. Mr. Whitehouse was very favorably impressed with the work being done, and will make estimates immediately of cost. There is considerable grading and filling to be done at the mauka end of the road.

Discussion on Hawaiian Airways hangar:

Dr. Hagood and Mr. Peacock visited John Rodgers Airport today and went over the location of the proposed Hawaiian Airways hangar. Mr. Damon thought the desired location would be too close to the runway, but Dr. Hagood and Mr. Peacock saw no reason why the Hawaiian Airways could not locate on area they wanted. Mr. Boyer agreed.

Parking space for opening day of Hawaiian Airways:

The question of temporary parking space for the opening day of the Hawaiian Airways was brought up. Dr. Hagood reported that \$55,000.00 had been allotted to airports; Mr. Damon felt that not too much should be spent for just the opening day. Mr. Peacock stated that if the proposed site behind the location of the Hawaiian Airways hangar was leveled off it would be satisfactory

for the parking of cars on the opening of the airway service, whereupon the Chairman appointed Mr. Peacock to take up the matter of filling in the ground, with Mr. Liu. It would be necessary to clear a space of approximately 100' x 500' and it was thought that the material taken off the top could be used to fill the lower end of the runway. In the meantime Dr. Hagood will take up the matter with Mr. Bigelow.

Building to be used as rest room, watchman's quarters, etc. for John Rodgers Airport:

Mr. Peacock suggested a building of some sort be erected on John Rodgers Airport to be used for watchman's quarters, retiring room for men and women other than Inter Island and Hawaiian Airways people, to be moved at a later date. The question of a permanent building was discussed.

Moved by Mr. Boyer and seconded by Mr. Peacock we recommend to the Superintendent of Public Works that a building be erected which could be removed from its location to be used as administration building, rest rooms, and watchman's quarters, at the airport. Unanimously carried. ✓

Progress on roadway:

Moved by Mr. Damon and seconded by Mr. Peacock that Dr. Hagood proceed to complete negotiations with the Mayor and Supervisors right away. ✓

Request of Mr. Aiken for hangar space at Hilo:

The Chairman reported that Mr. Worth Aiken asks for hangar space at Hilo. ✓

Moved by Mr. Boyer and seconded by Mr. Damon that Mr. Peacock as Chairman of the Committee "Go Ahead" with Hilo Airport allotment of space to the Hawaiian Airways. Carried. ✓


