

MINUTES OF THE TERRITORIAL AERONAUTICAL  
COMMISSION, held on Monday, March 24, 1930,  
in the Director's Room, Young Hotel Bldg.,  
Honolulu, T. H., at 3:45 P. M.

There being no changes in the minutes of the last meeting they were approved as circulated.

Superintendent of Airports:

Relative to the employment of Mr. Peacock as Superintendent of airports it is expected that a definite decision will be reached at the meeting of the Harbor Board Wednesday, March 26.

Dirt from the Damon Estate:

Mr. Damon reported that no dirt is available from the Damon Estate at Moanalua. Mr. Peacock thought he could possibly secure the necessary dirt for fill at John Rodgers Airport from the Honolulu Plantation Company, and will see Mr. A. Scott, Manager, relative to this.

Flight to Kona, Hawaii:

In regard to the proposed Kona trip the Chairman reported, after conference with Colonel Pratt that the Army planes are not suitable for water landings and suggested that Commander Herbster be called upon to take the Commission men to Hawaii in a Douglas flying boat. Tentative dates for the inspection trip have been set for April 4th and 5th, leaving here the morning of the 4th, spending the day at Kona, and returning the morning of the 5th. Mr. Anderson, Mr. Boyer, Mr. Brown, Mr. Damon and Mr. Peacock will make the trip and possibly Mr. Wooldridge and Dr. Hagood.

Report from Mr. Brown:

There is no one with proper authority at Waiakea airport to keep people and automobiles off the field reported Mr. Brown after his trip to Hawaii on Saturday. It was suggested by the Chamber of Commerce that the Commission request High Sheriff John C. Lane to appoint Mr. Richards, Jailor, Waiakea Prison Camp, a temporary deputy sheriff for this purpose.

It was moved by Mr. Brown, seconded by Mr. Damon and unanimously carried that the Chairman write Mr. Lane asking him to appoint Mr. David Richards as deputy sheriff at the Hilo Airport.

It was moved by Mr. Damon, seconded by Mr. Peacock and unanimously carried that Mr. Richards be authorized to place a line of stones along the Kamehameha Highway when it is finished and a fence off the roadway leading to Puumaile Home on our boundary to keep traffic off the field.

MINUTES CONTINUED:  
Monday, March 24, 1930

A blue-print of the Hilo Field was presented and plans for improving the runway and airport were discussed.

Employment of laborer:

Mr. Peacock has in mind a man whom he would like to hire for .40¢ an hour to drive a truck, blast, etc., at John Rodgers Airport. The man is familiar with drilling and blasting but has no license to use powder.

It was moved by Mr. Boyer and seconded by Mr. Damon that the matter be left in the hands of the Chairman and Mr. Peacock.

There being no further business, the meeting on motion adjourned.
