

MINUTES OF A MEETING OF THE TERRITORIAL AERONAUTICAL COMMISSION,
held on Wednesday, March 23, 1932, in the Gold Room of the Young
Hotel Building, Honolulu, T. H., at 12:00 o'clock, noon.

PRESENT: Messrs. R. A. Anderson, Chairman, E. L. Peacock,
Vern Hinkley, C. F. Damon, H. E. Wooldridge.

ABSENT: Messrs. G. I. Brown, F. O. Boyer.

The minutes of the last meeting were approved as circulated.

The purchase of a siren, types and sizes of which were considered by the Commission members, was discussed. On a motion by Mr. Wooldridge, seconded by Mr. Hinkley, it was unanimously carried that a siren be purchased, for John Rodgers Airport, at a price not to exceed \$450.00 installed and that the selection be left to Mr. Peacock and the Chairman.

New bids on the grassing of Wailua Airport should be received early next week. Work will be started as soon as possible thereafter. X

Sheriff Gordon Ross has appointed John K. Akau to take the place of David K. Richards on the Hilo Airport. Mr. Wooldridge suggested that the Chairman write to Mr. Foster regarding the change and ask him to see that the ideas of the Commission are carried out.

The Chairman read a letter from the Inter-Island Airways which stated that the grass at Upolu Point and Maalaea Airports is badly in need of mowing. On a motion by Mr. Peacock, seconded by Mr. Damon, it was unanimously carried that the Chairman write to both Mr. Watt and Mr. Wadsworth and give the authority to have this work done at both Airports provided that the job at either Airport does not exceed the sum of \$25.00.

Two letters, from mainland airports, in regard to our inquiry concerning a 180 degree turn prior to landing, were read but it was suggested that other replies be received before taking any action in this matter.

Mr. Anderson said that he had had a report to the effect that the newly-filled ditch at Maalaea Airport was very soft and might prove dangerous unless it was rolled and hardened. It was decided to await a report from Mr. Wadsworth before taking action.

Mr. Peacock again reported on the work that is being done at John Rodgers Airport. He stated that the work is progressing very slowly but that the rough grading of the cross-wind runway should be completed sometime next month.

There being no further business the meeting on motion adjourned.
