The minutes of the last meeting were approved after correction.

The Chairman read a letter from Mr. Bigelow about the grading and grassing project at Wailua Airport, Kauai. It was suggested by Mr. Boyer that the Chairman telephone Mr. Bigelow for a follow-up of this letter and see what funds we have available at the present time for this work and see if it is worth-while to wait for the road project to start before proceeding. X

The Chairman read a letter from George A. Will regarding the piles of dirt on the Molokai Airport. Mr. Will stated that these piles of dirt are to be moved as soon as the grader is available and thanked the Commission members for their praise of the Airport.

Letters from the Inter-Island Airways, Ltd. were read pertaining to the new plans made by the Commission for work on John Rodgers Airport. Inter-Island Airways feel that the most essential development at present would be to continue widening the runway. Mr. Peacock stated that he could see no necessity for this at the present time but feels that the most important job at hand now is to fill in a section near Hangar Number 2 so that planes could take off right in front of the Inter-Island Hangar without having to taxi down the field. The members decided to make a trip with Mr. Kennedy to the Airport on Monday, April 25, 1932 and then decide the best line of work to follow up.

There being no further business the meeting on motion adjourned.
