

MINUTES OF A MEETING OF THE TERRITORIAL AERONAUTICAL COMMISSION,  
held in the Gold Room of the Young Hotel Building, Honolulu, T. H.,  
on Wednesday, May 4, 1932, at 12:00 o'clock, noon.

PRESENT: Messrs. R. A. Anderson, Chairman, E. L. Peacock,  
C. F. Damon, G. I. Brown, H. E. Wooldridge, F. O.  
Boyer.

ABSENT: Mr. Vern Hinkley.

The minutes of the last meeting were approved as  
circulated.

The Chairman reported on a letter he had written to  
Mr. Bigelow and said that he had not yet received any answer to  
it. This letter had to do with the grassing and grading of  
the Wailua Airport.

Mr. Anderson stated that he had written Mr. Bailey  
inquiring what further action had been taken to acquire land  
for an Emergency Landing Field at Koholalele, Hamakua, Hawaii.

The subject of the Commission's abolishment was  
discussed. Mr. Brown stated that he was tendering his re-  
signation regardless of the action taken by any other members of  
the Commission. He felt that, in view of the large amount  
of time and effort put in by members of the Commission, they  
might at least have been entitled to a hearing. In view of  
the fact that no consideration had been shown, he, for one,  
felt that he did not care to waste his time further. Several  
other members expressed similar opinions and it was suggested  
that all members submit their resignations. Mr. Boyer and  
Mr. Damon urged that, in view of the trying conditions to which  
the Administration has been submitted, we not do anything that  
would draw further unfavorable publicity against the Adminis-  
tration. It was then moved by Mr. Damon, seconded by Mr.  
Peacock and carried, Mr. Brown not voting, that the Chairman  
call on the Governor expressing to him our sentiments and  
asking him whether the reason for the Commission's abolishment  
is dissatisfaction with the work that it has done or an  
effort to effect an economy.

Mr. Peacock asked Mr. Anderson to write to Colonel  
Brant asking him for copies of photos of all the Airports in  
the Islands. The Chairman agreed to do this.

There being no further business the meeting on  
motion adjourned.
