

MINUTES OF A MEETING OF THE TERRITORIAL AERONAUTICAL COMMISSION,  
held in the Gold Room of the Young Hotel Building, Honolulu, T. H.,  
on Wednesday, May 18, 1932, at 12:00 o'clock, noon.

PRESENT: Messrs. R. A. Anderson, Chairman, E. L. Peacock,  
Vern Hinkley, C. F. Damon, F. O. Boyer, H. E. Wooldridge.

Reading of the minutes of the meeting of May 4th was deferred.

The Chairman said that he had received a copy of a letter from the Governor accepting with regret Mr. George Ii Brown's resignation as a member of the Commission.

The Chairman made a report on his talk with the Governor regarding the abolishment of the Commission. The Governor stated that this was a start toward abolishing all boards and Commissions and carrying on their functions by the regular departments of the Government. He stated that there was nothing personal in the present move and that he had always backed the Commission. He expressed his appreciation of the work done by the Commission.

Mr. Peacock reported that Mr. Elliott of Inter-Island Airways has been trying to hinder the work that is being done on John Rodgers Airport. Mr. Boyer moved, with a second by Mr. Wooldridge, that the Commission purchase the coral necessary to complete this work. This motion was carried unanimously.

Mr. Anderson suggested that Mr. Peacock interview Mr. Bigelow relative to a vacation for Mr. Laningham, the John Rodgers Airport caretaker.

It was further decided that all Airport rules and regulations be revised. On a motion by Mr. Wooldridge, seconded by Mr. Hinkley, it was carried that Mr. Peacock be appointed to go over the rules and recommend any changes necessary.

It was decided that nothing further could be done about the Wailua Airport on Kauai until the Federal Aid Road Job is begun.

There being no further business the meeting on motion adjourned.
