MINUTES OF TERRITORIAL ASSOCIATIONAL CONTISSION CUSTING HELD AT THE CONTULN ARROST ON CEDRESDAY, MAY 29, 1929, AT 2:00 P. N.

READING OF MINUTES:

Mr. Dolan called the attention of the Chairman to some changes to be made in the minutes of the last meeting. He asked for the deleting of one of the statements made by him. He suggested that the words "at Lahaina" be added after the words "Old Race Tract". Mr. Dolan further suggested that in the minutes of the meeting of April 19, 1929 held at the Covernor's office, the word "air" in Paragraph 6 be changed to "prevailing wind".

REPORT OF CONTITUES:

- (1) RECEPTION AND ENTERTAINMENT -- No report.
- (2) EXAMINATION AND PATINGS OF PRIVATE FLYING FIELDS -- No report.
- (3) IAWS; LEGISLATION; RULES AND NEGULATIONS -- Colonel Smoot, Chairman discussed and recommended several changes to be made in the Air Commerce Regulations of the Territorial Aeronautical Commission. He stated that because the carrying of explosives was taken care of in the Air Commerce Regulations of the Department of Commerce, he thought that the clause on explosives in the regulations of the Territory was unnecessary. The following motion was made by Mr. Dolan, seconded and unanimously carried: "That Section 2, pp. 1, Air Commerce Regulations of the Territory of Hawaii be deleted".

Colonel Smoot further reported that the Federal law states that if a plane is licensed, then that license must be displayed prominently in the plane, whereas the Territorial law states that all planes must be licensed. It was moved by Mr. Dolan, seconded and unanimously carried: "That the Commission add to the present Territorial Law 'that every plane must display its license in a prominent and accessible place".

The following motion was made by Mr. Dolan, seconded and carried with one descending vote: "That the wording in Section 3, pp. 1, of the Air Commerce Regulations of the Territorial Aeronautical Commission be changed to read 'Dismond Head and a circular area of a radius of 1,000 yards from the rim of the crater of Dismond Head and extending in the air at an angle of 45° from the horizontal".

The discussion of Airport Rules of the Territory of Hawaii was taken up next. The following motion was made by Mr. Dolan, seconded and unanimously carried: "That in rule No. 1 the word 'commercial' be deleted".

The following motion was made by Mr. Clarke, seconded and unanimously carried: "That in all cases in the Airport Rules in which the word 'manager' is used; the \underline{m} is to be a small letter and not a capital letter.

The following motion was made by Mr. Clarke, seconded and unanimously carried: "That in Airport Rule No. 16 the words 'Territorial Aeronautical Commission' be changed to 'field manager'".

- (4) LOCATION OF FLYING FIELDS AND AIRWAYS -- No report.
- (5) DEVELOPING; DESIGNING; EQUIPMENT OF AIRPORTS AND EMERGENCY FIELDS -The following motion was made by Mr. Dolan, Chairman, seconded and unanimously
 carried: "That the plans for development of various Territorial airports and
 landing fields be approved as submitted to the Commission".

The following motion was made by Mr. Clarke, seconded and unanimously carried: "That the Commission express their appreciation to Committee No. 5 for the excellent work done on the plans".

(6) FIELD OPERATIONS -- The following motion was made by Mr. Cullen, seconded and unanimously carried: "That Mr. Clerke dictate to the secretary the rates and charges recommended by him for the operation of sirports and landing fields so that the members of the Commission will have a chance to study these before they are passed upon". These rates will be discussed at a later meeting.

OLD BUSINESS:

Mr. Stanley C. Kennedy, Vice-President and Manager of the Inter-Island Airways, Limited was present to discuss with the Commission the erection of hangars on John Rodgers Airport and to request a specific location be granted his company. It was unanimously decided by the Commission to give the Inter-Island Airways the first choice as to hangar sites as this organization was the first to apply for such.

Colonel Smoot, Chairman, who is also a member of the Aviation Committee of the Chamber of Commerce reported that the Aviation Committee had met and passed a motion that that Committee go on record as favoring and recommending to the Directors of the Wonclulu Chamber of Commerce that a fund of \$10,000 be raised by the Chamber of Commerce to be spent on improvements to the John Rodgers Airport. The following motion was made by Mr. Cullen, seconded and unanimously carried: "That the Commission request the Monolulu Chamber of Commerce to build an administration building on the John Rodgers Airport should the \$10,000 be raised".
