MINUTES OF A MEETING OF THE TERRITORIAL AERONAUTICAL COMMISSION, held on Wednesday, December 3, 1931, in the Young Building, Honolulu, T. H., at 12 o'clock, noon.

PRESENT: Messrs. Anderson, Hinkley, Wooldridge, Boyer and Peacock.

ABSENT: Messrs. Brown and Damon.

The minutes of the last meeting were approved as read.

Mr. Peacock reported that Mr. Rush had written to Mr. Gates asking him to figure on grading an additional area, planting grass and laying water pipe on the field at the Wailua Airport. Mr. Rush has received no reply as yet. If the figures are too high bids will be called for.

Mr. Anderson stated that he had received a phone call from Mr. McCreery who advised that Mr. McCurley who is operating a plane in Hilo finds much interest shown in flying lessons and pleasure flights. Students must pass medical examinations. Appointing a physician is out of the jurisdiction of the Commission, but Mr. Peacock suggested that we send Capt. Burt a copy of the letter received from Mr. Foster regarding Mr. McCurley's activities, asking him if he can appoint a temporary physician for this purpose.

A letter from the Inter-Island Airwasy was read stating that the drainage ditch at the Maalaea Airport was dangerous. Mr. Peacock will make an estimate of the cost of replacing the ditch with two conduits. Mr. Boyer moved that Mr. Wadsworth be asked for his opinion as to the hazard the ditch presents as it is at the present time. The motion was seconded by Mr. Wooldridge and unanimously carried.

Mr. Peacock reported that he has received no word from Nolle Smith as to a bid on hauling coral from Pearl Harbor to John Rodgers Airport. He recommended that we get prices on hauling this coral from different draying companies, we to supply the shovel and spread the coral. Mr. Peacock moved that we spend \$999.00 and obtain as much surace coral as possible. The motion was seconded by Mr. Wooldridge and carried unanimously.

There being no further business, the meeting on motion adjourned.
